The Executive Leadership Council (ELC) is the preeminent membership organization committed to increasing the number of global Black executives in C-Suites, on corporate boards and in global enterprises.

UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS OVERVIEW

The mission of The ELC's Undergraduate Scholarships is to build a pipeline of Black corporate talent by supporting the academic achievement and development of Black undergraduate and graduate students.

The ELC offers five undergraduate scholarship programs:

- three are designed for students pursuing business degrees
- one is designed for students currently enrolled in a mechanical or chemical engineering program
- one is designed for students pursuing degrees in business, insurance and risk management, or a related field

Scholarships are awarded to students who demonstrate academic excellence, leadership skills and a commitment to community service. In addition to receiving a scholarship award, a group of high achieving students will be selected to participate in The ELC's Honors Symposium. The Symposium is a multi-day professional development experience offering exclusive career development and networking opportunities.

ALVARO L. MARTINS SCHOLARSHIP Minimum GPA: 3.2	 Created in honor of The ELC's founding member, the first president and CEO of The Council and an alumnus of Howard University Open to high achieving undergraduate Black male students attending one of the nation's top Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs)
ANN FUDGE SCHOLARSHIP Minimum GPA: 3.2	 Named after the first woman chair of The Council and former chairman and CEO of Young & Rubicam Brands Open to high achieving undergraduate Black female students attending one of the nation's top HBCUs
AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN BUSINESS COMMENTARY Minimum GPA: 3.2	 Sponsored by The Coca-Cola Foundation, top undergraduate students are invited to compete in this national writing competition centered on exploring business trends, issues and insights Open to high achieving undergraduate Black students attending an accredited four-year college or university
PRAXAIR ENGINEERS OF TOMORROW SCHOLARSHIP Minimum GPA: 3.0	 Established by Praxair, Inc. to provide opportunities for minority college students pursuing careers in engineering Open to high achieving undergraduate minority students currently pursuing a mechanical or chemical engineering degree
NATIONWIDE'S FUTURE LEADERS SCHOLARSHIP Minimum GPA: 3.5	 Established with a donation from Nationwide to provide scholarship awards to students pursuing degrees in business, insurance and risk management, or a related field Open to high achieving undergraduate Black students attending an accredited four-year college or university
